1. Your Timeline isn't wide enough to display object timing.

What should you do?

4. You have created a splash screen for your course, which starts with an animation. You want the Start Course button to appear only after the animation is over.

What should you do?

- A. Associate a conditional action to make this work.
- B. Right-click the button on the timeline and select Sync with Playhead.
- C. Right-click the button on the timeline and select Show for the rest of the slide.
- D. Drag the start of the button to the end of the animation on the timeline.

5. You are adding effects to your objects and find it cumbersome to keep switching from the Timeline panel to Effects panel to match the timing.

What should you do to reduce your efforts?

- A. Switch to Effects workspace.
- B. Switch to Review workspace.
- C. Take a screenshot of the Timeline panel and refer to it while working with the Effects panel.
- D. First add all the effects and then synchronize the timing.
